The Committee held Robert Marshall the Cabinet Member for Public Health and Public Safety to account, He gave an introduction to the challenges and issues in relation to the outcomes in support of the Strategic Plan. He identified the excessive number of winter deaths as a challenge, that there were two principal strategies to address this, greater uptake of Influenza vaccination by the vulnerable and an improvement in the quality of housing. He advised that alcohol was also a contributory factor as were often the reason for slips and falls. It was an accepted cause for some long term complaints in particular liver disease. He cited maternal smoking and smoking generally as a negative across all areas of health but interventions and initiatives were having a positive effect. He commented that there were also issues around underage conception, early interventions by health partnerships were having a positive effect. Child obesity is a challenge but overall the figures are going down due to ongoing work across the County. The disappearance of Healthy Schools Initiative, healthy diet and exercise, and the move towards academies had also presented challenges. There was an acceptance that school heads and governors had a critical role to play in this area. These are issues that are universal and not exclusive to Staffordshire. Questions were raised on issues that included the development of integrated care plans, uptake of flu vaccinations alcohol and drug related matters and the differences across the County in life expectancy, infant mortality and underage conceptions. The Committee questioned representatives of from the Heart and Stroke Network, Staffordshire Cluster of Primary Care Trusts, Clinical Commissioning Groups and the Joint Commissioning Unit who presented a review outlining work undertaken in respect of Regional Stroke Services. The Committee raised questions around travelling times, public transport links, and local health inequalities being taken into consideration and cross border movement of patients. It was agreed that the Committee be formally consulted on the implications of the review on completion.	All
The members discussed the criteria to be met if a hospital was to successfully achieve hyper acute status. Namely 600 stroke patients each year, UHNS regularly exceeded this number and has the status. Queens Hospital Burton was seeking to obtain the status but acknowledged a need to increase patient numbers in this area. Current numbers of 350 fell short however it was anticipated increased numbers of patients from Tamworth, Stoke and South Derbyshire in the future may remedy the deficit. Mid-Staffs would have the status of an acute stroke unit.

Burton Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust :- Following concerns raised by members in October, I have been in contact with the Trust in relation to issues at Queens Hospital who advised over the course of 2 weeks the Trust has had a number of its inpatient facilities closed to admissions due to the outbreak of Norovirus.
