#### 13 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Barnett, A Little and Ray.

#### 14 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Councillors Anketell, Checkland, and Warfield declared a non-pecuniary interest in Item 7 as members of Lichfield City Council.

Councillor Eagland declared a non-pecuniary interest in Item 7 as a member of Lichfield City Council and as the Staffordshire County Councillor for Lichfield Rural North.

Councillor Salter declared a non-pecuniary interest in Item 7 as the Chair of Shenstone Parish Council.

Councillor Cross declared a non-pecuniary interest in Item 7 as a member of Fradley and Streethay Parish Council.

#### 15 MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

The minutes of the previous meeting were taken as read and approved as a correct record by the Chair.

#### 16 WORK PROGRAMME

The committee noted the current contents of the work programme and were informed that this may be amended before the next meeting.

# 17 PROPOSED DIVERSION OF PUBLIC FOOTPATH NO. 0.333 (PART) IN THE PARISH OF BURNTWOOD

Robin Carr (Public Rights of Way Consultant) presented the report to the committee. Mr Carr explained that whilst there were no objections in principle to the diversion there had been one or two technical issues relating to diversion in the past. However, he confirmed that there were being addressed by new orders and changes to the alignments.

Members outlined concern at the past approach of developers; building properties and developments without seeking permission to divert any existing footpaths beforehand. It was confirmed that any potential condition put in place to mitigate this would be a matter for the Planning Committee. The Chair confirmed that the concerns expressed would be passed on.

**RESOLVED:** The committee approved the proposed diversion of Public Footpath No. 0.333 (part) in the Parish of Burntwood as set out in Appendix A of the report.

# 18 PROPOSED DIVERSION OF PUBLIC FOOTPATH NO. 6 (PART) IN THE PARISH OF ELFORD

Robin Carr (Public Rights of Way Consultant) presented the report to the committee. Mr Carr outlined that the path has historically been obstructed by the social club and housing association homes. This proposal deals with the social club element and is necessary to facilitate development to take place in the future. It was confirmed that the continuation of the footpath outside of the development site is due to be addressed by the County Council. Mr Carr informed the committee that the developers had been in discussion with the Parish Council on this matter and the Parish Council had indicated strong opposition to any proposal to extinguish the footpath entirely.

Members agreed that whilst diversion was a sensible course of action, they believed that developers should seek permission to divert footpaths before beginning any proposed developments.

**RESOLVED:** The committee approved the proposed diversion of Public Footpath No. 6 (part) in the Parish of Elford as set out in Appendix A of the report.

#### 19 COMMUNITY GOVERNANCE REVIEW - STAGE II CONSULTATION

Mark Hooper (Governance Manager & Monitoring Officer) presented the report to the committee. He explained that the report summarises key issues identified during the second stage consultation, with a view to agreeing final recommendations, as set out in section 3.11 of the report.

The new proposals involved revising the number of parish members to 10 for Fradley and 7 for Streethay parish councils. No objections were received in relation to the proposal to reduce Longdon from 11 to 9 members. The committee was informed that Lichfield City Council had agreed with additions to Curborough and Leomansley additions but did want to reduce the St Johns ward from 6 to 5 members, due to increased development there over coming years. The cumulative effect of all proposed changes would take the City Council from 27 to 28 members.

Mr Hooper confirmed to members that there was no need to include Shenstone parish council in the order as there is no recommendation for change on that parish.

**RESOLVED:** The committee gave consideration to the draft Community Governance Review recommendations as set out in section 3.11 of the report and determined these final recommendations to be submitted to Council for approval.

## 1. Executive Summary

- 1.1 A polling district is an area whose electorate are all invited to vote at the same polling place. A polling place is a location in which one or more polling stations are provided to allow the electorate to vote. A polling station is the room, or part of a room, where voting takes place.
- 1.2 This review has been conducted on behalf of the Returning Officer in anticipation of the 2023 full District and Parish elections to ensure sufficient suitable locations are available given the recent dramatic changes brought about by Covid 19 and the voter ID checks, and accessibility requirements under the Elections Act 2022.
- 1.3 This report outlines the polling stations likely to be introduced at these elections, should sufficient nominations be received for each polling district for a ballot to be required.

## 2. Recommendations

2.1 To approve the polling stations proposed at Appendix A for use by the Returning Officer in the 2023 District and Parish elections.

## 3. Background

- 3.1 The Council is required to complete a review of all parliamentary polling districts and polling places in the district at least every five years, the last being completed in November 2019. Since then, we have also seen emergency locations introduced because of the Covid 19 Pandemic in preference to schools and other locations set aside as vaccination sites. A full review is not due to be considered before November 2024, however given the pressure on certain locations and the new requirements itwas felt appropriate to bring these locations forward for consideration.
- 3.2 Under the Elections Act 2022 all electors seeking to cast their vote in a polling station must now present approved photo ID to prove their identity and be provided with a ballot paper. The current regulations do not yet impact on postal voters. For any registered elector who does not have a suitable form of photographic ID they can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate free of charge before 25 April.
- 3.3 Public Campaigns have been launched by the government regarding the new requirements and LDC has a targeted communications campaign in the run up to the election to ensure all voters area aware

of the need to present photographic ID and have a suitable form provided in time if they do not.

- 3.4 This means that polling stations may have increasing pressures this year due to the volume of electors who may arrive without suitable forms of ID who require additional assistance from polling staff on the day. Additional space must be provided for the checks to be carried out and private areas to check ID or for the removal of headwear etc. to confirm identity.
- 3.5 In addition, the returning officer and election team have additional duties to ensure we provide suitable support for all electors to cast their vote, be those additional physical measures to read the ballot papers, hold the pencil to cast their vote or personal support to assist them in moving through a station. To assist this the DRO is seeking engagement with disabled voters and groups to understand local needs and barriers to voting at a polling station.
- 3.6 In any event this means that the current stations in use have been assessed to consider these new requirements and this has resulted in some locations being unsuitable. A list of all proposed stations is attached at appendix A. Those highlighted in yellow are new stations, proposed as alternatives to avoid school closures wherever possible due to the disruption of the additional Bank Holiday for the King's Coronation. Schools are listed in green text and seats which were uncontested in the last all-out local elections are in red text.
- 3.7 As part of the election planning process all possible venues have been sent notification of the election dates with appeals for availability. Some of these requests have already resulted in refusals or requests for us to seek alternative venues. Members can be further apprised on the progress of this during the committee.

The new legislation has been introduced to take effect during the May 2023 elections. The national VAC application portal went live on 16 Jan 2023.

All registered electors (or their proxys) are now required to present approved Photo ID at a polling station in order to be provided with a ballot paper.

In addition, returning officers are now required to consider any measure which assists voters with additional needs in order to cast their vote.
