Executive Summary 1.

To consider an application received from Fradley Residential LLP, Woolsington House, Woolsington, 1.1 Newcastle Upon Tyne, NE13 8BF for the diversion of public footpath No. 43 (part) in the Parish of Fradley and Streethay. The application is to be considered under the Town and Country Planning Act, Section 257.

2. Recommendations

2.1 To approve the proposed diversion of Public Footpath No. 43 (part) in the Parish of Fradley and Streethay as set out in Appendix A to allow for necessary development.

3. Background

- 3.1 An application has been submitted under the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 from Fradley Residential LLP, Woolsington House, Woolsington, Newcastle Upon Tyne, NE13 8BF for the proposed diversion of Public Footpath No. 43 in the Parish of Fradley and Streethay.
- 3.2 The application has been made in connection with planning application 10/01498/OUTMEI for the demolition of existing buildings and redevelopment of the site to provide up to 750 new homes, primary school, health centre, nursery, public house, public and private open space, car and cycle parking together with landscaping and associated servicing (all matters reserved except points of access) and under the same application, highway improvement under reference 10/01498/OUTMEI.
- 3.3 Attached at Appendix A is a plan showing a route for Footpath No. 43 (part). The footpath route is shown as points A to N with a dashed black line. Following completion of the development it is proposed that this diverted route will become permanent.
